## **What is the NEFCU Giant Pumpkin Regatta & Festival?**

The Giant Pumpkin Regatta & Festival began as a fun event by the Lake Champlain Regional Chamber of Commerce (LCRCC) in 2008. It drew over a thousand spectators to the Burlington Waterfront to watch community members race giant hollowed out pumpkins on Lake Champlain. The pumpkins were grown and donated by farmers in the Vermont Giant Vegetable Growers Association.

In 2009, LCRCC partnered with Linking Learning to Life (LLL) to host the event as a fundraiser for a youth leadership program, PILOT, which they jointly coordinate. New England Federal Credit Union (NEFCU) signed on as the title sponsor. A small festival was added to the regatta with kids' activities, pie eating contests, and local food vendors providing yummy fall food. The event drew an estimated 5,000 people to the waterfront and raised \$15,000 for the PILOT program.



The event also received a LOT of press! This year, ESPN spent the day at the waterfront and it was featured in a CBS News, Boston Globe, and a SevenDays Stuck In Vermont video blog. Other local media included the Charlie and Ernie Show: News Talk 620 WVMT, Burlington Free Press, WCAX, Fox 44, and WPTZ. Last year, it made Sports Illustrated's 'Most Ridiculous Competitions' list and was spoofed on Saturday Night Live!

**So what's the result?** An annual fall time fundraising event that brings the community together to watch ridiculous pumpkin boats, eat yummy food, and have some festival fun...during Vermont's beautiful Columbus Day weekend!

### **How is money raised?**

Funds are raised a variety of ways:

- Local businesses and individuals sponsor pumpkins at 2 different levels:
  - Harvest Moon Pumpkin Sponsor: \$1,000
  - Falling Leaves Pumpkin Sponsor: \$750
- Food, agricultural, and craft vendors pay a \$100 vendor fee and donate 10% of the day's profits to LLL
- Minimal fees for festival activities and contests

### **What is Linking Learning to Life?**

Linking Learning to Life is a 501© 3 non-profit organization that develops and manages a wide range of programs and services that help K-12 age youth prepare for life after high school, especially related to careers and continuing education. The organization plays a critical role of connecting schools with businesses, colleges, and other community organizations to create exciting student learning opportunities. These opportunities include mentoring, community service, leadership development, career exploration, internships, paid employment and college access. ## **What is the PILOT program?**

PILOT (Program to Inspire Leadership, Opportunity, and Thought) is a youth leadership program for high school juniors in Chittenden County, Vermont. The vision behind PILOT is to motivate and empower young people to make a positive difference within their communities through leadership, creativity, and action. This program targets “latent leaders”, bringing together juniors from four Chittenden County high schools (Burlington, South Burlington, Champlain Valley Union, and Essex High Schools), for an interactive year long community and career exploration program.

## **How do I become a vendor and what’s included?**

In order to be a vendor at the event, the vendor fee is \$100 as well as a suggested donation of 10% of sales from the day. Vendors must supply proof of insurance for \$2 million dollars naming the city of Burlington as “additional insured” (not listed as the Certificate Holder) and also must provide a copy of the State of Vermont Food Service Establishment License and Permit.

All vendors are asked to be set up between 7:30 and 9:00am and to stay throughout the day. We are not able to provide tents but we encourage you to bring your own. We can provide electricity, if you need it.
